What Is The Common App?

- Not-for-profit organization
- Provides an admission application students can submit to any of the 600 member institutions
- Serves students and member institutions who agree to make admissions decisions based on a review of the "whole student"





Why Use the Common App?

- Complete one online or paper application to send to many schools
- More time can be spent focusing on visiting colleges, writing essays, doing homework, participating in extracurricular activities or completing scholarship applications
- Sending forms (ie. transcript, letters of recommendation) is more streamlined
- It keeps track of which sections you have completed and which ones are pending

Common App vs. College's Own Form

- Supported by all member institutions
- Equal consideration given to Common App and school's own form
- Only available application for many colleges and universities

- Remember to declare yourself a "first-year" student
- Create a professional email account for all college correspondence
- Remember the email address used and password created
- All accounts are cleared each August








- Answer yes to fee waiver question to see requirements
- If student qualifies, he/she receives unlimited college application fee waivers through Common App





Family

- Read questions carefully and answer completely
- Complete questions about both parents, even if they are divorced
- Ability to add information about step-parents
- Choose the appropriate parent for where you make your permanent home








Education and Testing


- High school information
- School counselor
- College coursework
- GPA, class rank and honors
- Self-report multiple test scores
- Future plans
- Preview your app to be sure responses fit







Activities



- Provide up to 10 activities in order of importance
- List extracurricular activities and work experience
- Provide details and accomplishments (i.e. varsity letter, captain of team, officer in club, etc.)
- Not all colleges accept resumes





Writing

- 250 650 word essay
- Must cut and paste essay or write directly in the space provided
- Word count feature
- Formatting carries over
- Space for additional information up to 650 words

▼ Personal Essay

Some colleges require submission of the personal essay with your Common Application. You may submit a personal essay to any college, even if it is not required by that college. If not required by a college, you will be given the option during submission to include your essay or not for that college. *








Residency

Supplements

- School specific questions
- Every college has the option to choose which questions, if any, to ask
- Must complete in order to submit application to the college






School Forms

FERPA Release Authorization

You must complete the release authorization process, which will allow transcripts and recommendations to be submitted on your behalf through Naviance eDocs. release authorization



- Read release authorization carefully
- If you do not waive your right to access letters of recommendation, some teachers may not wish to send them and some colleges may disregard letters submitted on your behalf





School Forms

- Invite your school counselor and teachers to submit school report form
- If your school uses
 Naviance edocs, that will be indicated here
- Check with your school counselor about the procedure at your high school



Payment

- Click on each individual college to pay your application fee
- Payment methods vary from institution to institution
- Possible methods of payment
 - Online credit card or echeck
 - Fee waiver request
 - Mail check







Tips

- Cannot change your responses on an application once it has been submitted
- Can create a second version to send to additional schools
- The Application, Payment, and Supplement submissions are three distinct processes
- There may be additional forms required
- Preview your application BEFORE submission
